Salisbury's senior Betar group, Shevei Zion comprises sixth-form students and school-leavers, most of whom are Madrichim.

This year has witnessed a transformation of the traditional Shevei Zion group. The Toch-niet chosen was "Basic Betariut", a subject that can never be exhausted and never fails to interest veterans or the considerable influx of new members who have joined the group.
