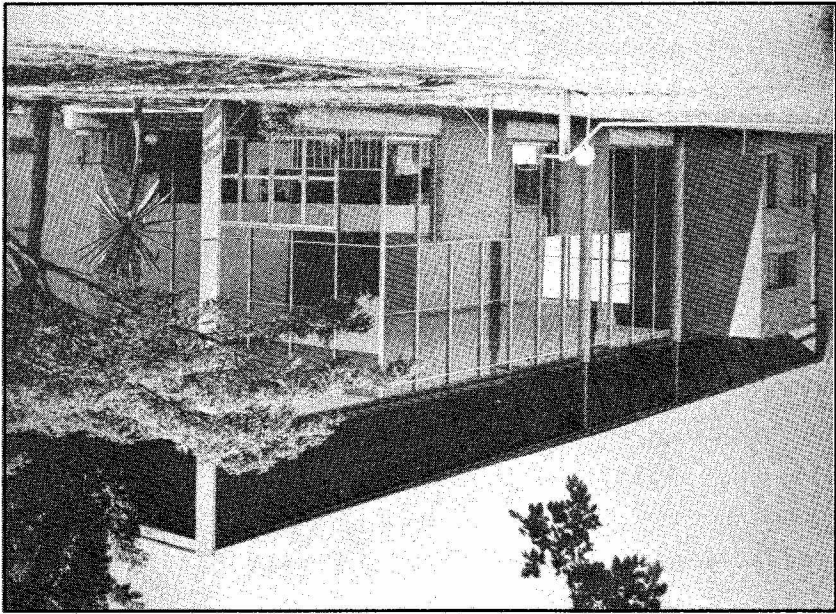


HAROLD HEREW CONCEPTION SYNAGOGUE

Mayoral Service In Salisbury

On Sunday afternoon October 2, a Mayoral Service was held in the new Synagogue of the Salisbury Hebrew Congregation, conducted by the Mayor's Chaplain, the Rev. P. Copperman.

The Synagogue looked extremely colourful with all the civic dignitaries in their robes and chains of office, the uniforms of the many heads of the Armed Services and the B.S.A. Police, and the attractive white-clothed phalanx of the choir.

H.W. the Mayor, Cllr. R. S. Cowan, and the Mayoress were accompanied by the Deputy Mayor, the acting Chief Executive Officer, Aldermen and City Councillors; and among the distinguished visitors were the President of Rhodesia, the Hon. J. J. Wrathall, and Mrs. Wrathall, Cabinet Ministers, Senior Officers of the Armed Forces and Police and a number of prominent clerics, including Professor R. Craig, Principal of the University of Rhodesia.

H.W. the Mayor read the lesson, taken from the concluding paragraphs of Ecclesiastes, the Ark was opened by the President of the Congregation, Mr. I. Rabinowitz, and the Prayer for Rhodesia recited by the Mayor's Chaplain.

Rev. Copperman, in the course of an impressive address, displayed a *Lulav* and *Eithrog* and explained the significance of the four portions of the *Succoth* symbols in relation to sound government, civic responsibilities, and care for the poor and needy and the welfare of the community generally, irrespective of race, creed or colour.

Appropriate psalms were rendered by the Sharon School Choir under the able baton of Mrs. Aliza Hatchuel, which added greatly to the beauty, dignity and solemnity of a truly memorable occasion. Incidentally, this was the first time a Mayoral Service had been attended by a President of Rhodesia.
