What a token of religious solidarity has this Congregati 1. created to-day! For in all humility and with that civic parts pride, we, of the House of Israel, can truly greet our 1st. citizen of Lusaka, together with his fellow-Councilloss , who, to-day bave foregathered in this House of Worship dedicated to To God Almighty, and in unison pary for the welfare of our Sovereagn, our Country, and our leadership. For did not the ancient ancient Prophet of Israel, ask, with his impassioned voice:-"Have we not all one Father? Has not one God created us all".

By a happy co-incidence, this very day, known as LAG BO'OMER, introduces a very happy note in the Religious Calendar of the Jewish people. It is indeed a semi-festival and marks a new erasa new begining yeasa new harmony in

human relationships.

We rejoice, therefore, with a sense of gratitude weighted with humility, that the signal and deserved honour bestoweds upon a son of our Community, a boother in faith, whose public service has been accepted willingly and appreciatively, in that spirit of fellowship & fraternal co-operation, is but symbolic of that enlightened and exalted tradition of that liberty of conscience, of freedom & opportunity, which has characterised this land of ours.

And, my friends, it is in this spirit that I extend the greetings of my Faith and my People to this representati and distinguisghed Congregation, with the immortal words of

the Prophet Isaiah :-

Peace, Peace to join all, who have come from far & near".

How apt, therefore, is the maxim of our Scriptures when the author of the Book of Proverbs asserts: "Righteousness emaltheth a nation" for it was indeed in the spirit of Righteousness which held a pride of place in the hearts of our Pioneers of this Country, and helped them to establish themselves in this part of the Commonwealth, and take their rightful place in the full life of this growing Community, which has made this CIVIC Service, an expression of Faith as well of Thanksgiving.

For a Mayoral Service is first & formeost an hour of DEDICATION. It is also a challenge and a test of character. For to-day, more than ever perhaps, do we need the high integrity, that sense of public service which can

transcend even personal interests.
