it is told of one of our Sages (Rabbi Yochanan) that when he finished reading the Book of JOB, which tells of of the mysteries of life and death, that he would say:—
"ASHREI HA-ISH" Happy is the man, who had given full satisfaction to his Creator; who has grown with a good name and who can depart this world with a good name." This is indeed a avery significant statement, that we can all take to hearth; for it simply means, that man's period on earth, which he has been granted, should be so full of purpose; so great in blessings to all mankind, that when he is called to higher service, and enters the BET OLAM, the House of Eternity, we could then know, that he has left this world a better place than when he found it.

And so, friends, let us remember that the Soulawhich God had given us is inherently pure, and as long as we remain true to our God-given destiny, so shall our Faith remain dea thless.
